

# WHAT'S CLOSE BY



## SWIMMING

Great swimming directly in front of Beachcomber. The southern end of Potato Point, Potato Point Creek or Bar Beach at Narooma offers a great option for families on rough days. Please remember beaches are not patrolled.



## SURFING

Surf breaks work in most wind / swell directions. Located within walking distance to Beachcomber.



## FISHING

Beach, rock and estuarine fishing within walking distance. Small boat ramps at the end of Horse Island Road. Please remember safety first as big waves occur at any time.



## BIRDWATCHING

The sand spit north towards Tuross Heads, Lake Tarourga and Lake Brunderee are havens for sea/migratory birds. Please keep your distance.



## WHALE WATCHING

Humpback and southern right whales (June to October), seals and dolphins can be viewed from the high vantage points at Blackfellows Point, Jabarra Point, Potato Point and Jemison's Point.



## KAYAKING/ CANOEING

Launch at the end of South Tuross Beach Track behind Beachcomber which accesses Tuross Lake system and the Horse Head Road boat ramp. Great kayaking from Potato Point Creek to Lake Brunderee, exploring Lake Tarourga and Lake Brou.



## BIKE / WALK TRAILS

Bike

A number of bike and walk trails in and around Beachcomber. Walk north along the Blackfellows Point Beach to the Tuross Lake river mouth or south from Jemison's Point to Dalmeny. Take the South Tuross Trail to Tuross Lake behind Beachcomber or walk along the lake track opposite Site 1 at the northern most point of Beachcomber.
